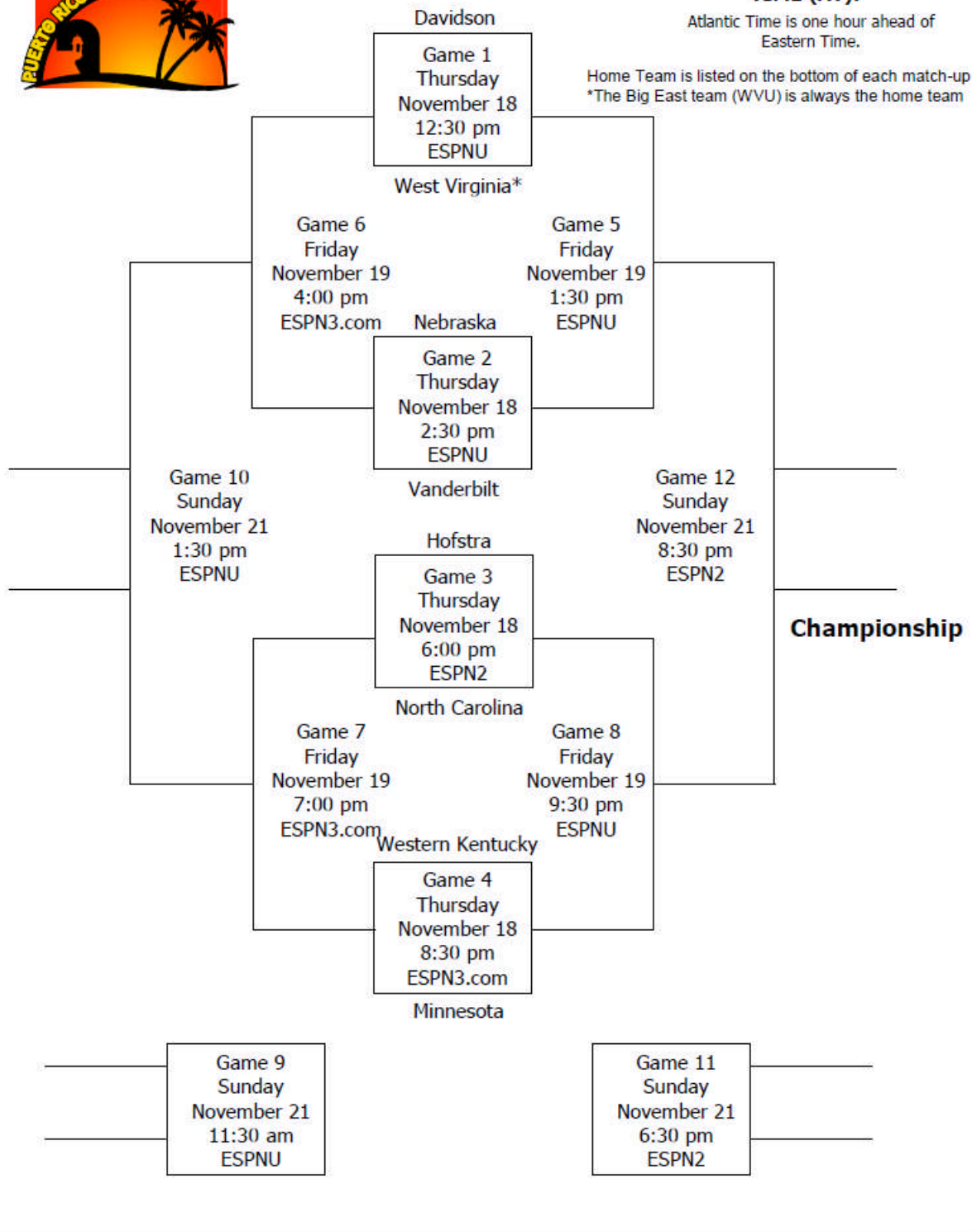

**NEBRASKA'S IN-SEASON TOURNAMENT NOTES** - Nebraska is 105-98 (.517) all-time during in-season tournaments, dating back to the 1946 Big Seven Holiday Tournament in Kansas City. Nebraska played in the conference holiday tournament (Big Six of Big Seven) every year from 1946 until 1978. The Huskers have 17 in-season tournament titles in program history, with the most recent one coming at the 2000 San Juan Shoot-out. Nebraska won its three games at the 2000 event by a total of four points, earning one-point wins over Iona and Kent State before winning the title with a 72-70 win over SMU. Nebraska won 12 of its 17 in-season tournament titles between 1986 and 2000, including 10 Ameritas Classics over an 11-year stretch from 1988 to 1998. Nebraska is 8-4 in its four previous tournaments in Puerto Rico, reaching the finals of the 1990 San Juan Shootout and placing third in the 1994 San Juan Shootout. This will be Nebraska's third in-season tournament under Doc Sadler, as the Huskers reached the finals of the HoopsTV Las Vegas Invitational in 2009 and had a third-place showing (2-1 record) in the 2006 Rainbow Classic.

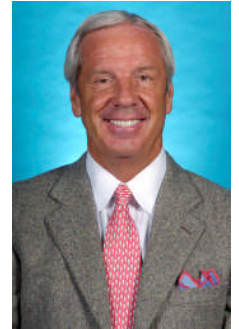

WKU defeated Wisconsin-Milwaukee and lost to LSU in the Baton Rouge, La., regional portion of the Preseason NIT a year ago, and followed that up with a 1-1 showing in the consolation round in Bowling Green, Ky. The Hilltoppers have eight tournament crowns to their credit, with the most recent title coming in the 2001 NABC Classic in Lexington, Ky. That tournament was highlighted by a 12-point win over fourth-ranked Kentucky, which was coached by now-Minnesota head man Tubby Smith. WKU has made two previous trips to San Juan for an early-season invitational tournament, finishing seventh in the San Juan Shootout in both 1989 and 1995.
